

The write-up is supplemented by a flow chart, a list of program instructions and detail cards, and a punched test deck for card systems or a test tape for Model D systems. The cards or records in each test block are numbered consecutively in columns 78-80 as follows:

1. Title Card (0A)
2. Two Program Chaining Routine Cards (02-03)
3. Three Title and Headings Print Routine Cards (04-06)
4. Four special program cards to set up instructions that are effective only when tests are run from tape (07-10)
5. Program Instructions and Detail Cards (11-???)

Cards in Item 2 are supplied only for those tests that may be chained.

Before using any of the test blocks, separately or in chain fashion, it is important that you understand three basic routines that apply to a majority of the tests. These routines are:

1. Program Loading Routine
2. Program Chaining Routine
3. Title and Headings Print Routine

In addition to the above routines, there are three other routines that are used in connection with tapes. These routines are discussed in the following block descriptions:

1. Write Test Tape Routine (Block No. 5300)
2. Read Test Tape Routine (Block No. 5310)
3. Copy Test Tape Routine (Block No. 5320)
